# The Acacia Association Board of Directors Meeting March 8, 2022

The Board of Directors Meeting of March 8, 2022 was brought to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Eckert.

Directors in Attendance: President Eckert, Director Consolo, Director Herley, Director Kwiatek, Director Cione, Director Boyd, Director McMillin and Director Voyles.

Directors Absent: Director Kalinoski.

Meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Director Boyd was sworn in by President Eckert.

President Eckert announced the resignation of Director Sharon Kalinoski, effective Wednesday, March 9, 2022.

Director Consolo motioned to approve the meeting minutes for the February 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022 Board of Director's Meeting, which was seconded by Director Kwiatek.

Minutes for the February 8th, 2022 approved by vote of 6-0-1

#### **Homeowner Forum:**

Acacia Resident, Joe who lives on Elmwood suggested we put wind screens up on the tennis court fences, and a port-o-potty by the Acacia Park or tennis courts. This resident also suggested we leave up the tennis and basketball nets longer, and only take them down for December, January, and February. The resident's last question was why do we not put in a Bocce Ball court where the Shuffle Board is? President Eckert responded that this will all be brought up to the Recreation Committee, however the Bocce Ball is not being done because of funds.

Danuta from Heatherwood asked about Rules and Regulations, she will meet with Director Kwiatek for a Welcome Basket meeting.

Edita from Elmwood Court asked if only one key is needed for all courts. The board responded that one key is for the tennis courts (both locks), and one key is for the basketball courts.

#### **Treasurers Report:**

Income - February 2020 \$98,678.00 (assessments, late fees, closing fees, etc.)

Expenses - February 2020 -\$62,571.86

Capital Expenditure -\$6,500.00 (deposit for fence)

Transfer - Capitol Replacement

Net Income for February 2020 \$17,606.14



Unusual expenses for February included \$20,184.00 for snow plowing thanks to our snowing month, \$881.03 to purchase checks for the office and \$782.00 for repairs to the sprinkler system in the clubhouse.

In February there were 16 accounts past due for a total of \$5,595.26 due to missed assessment payments, late fees

and fines. There were also 13 accounts that were brought up to date. This is a significant drop (\$11,076.99 in January) in past due accounts and monies owed Acacia.

Residents are encouraged to enroll in ACH – automatic payment – for monthly assessments. This avoids any chance of missed payments and late fees. Currently 63% of residents use ACH. There is no charge for ACH and the assessment amount is withdrawn from your account on the  $20^{\rm th}$  of each month.

Director Boyd motioned to approve the Treasurer's Report as presented seconded by Director Consolo.

The motion approved with an 6-0-1 vote.

#### **Clubhouse Director's Report:**

There were no clubhouse rentals in the month of February.

Bunco night was held on March 1<sup>st</sup> at 6:30 pm in the clubhouse. Face masks were optional. We had a better turn out this month and had two tables playing bunco. We will again hold Bunco next month on April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 6:30 pm. Please bring your own beverage and \$5.00 for the prize money.

#### **Recreation Facilities Director's Report:**

Time to start looking for last year's Pool ID card – you will need it to renew for this summer. Owners that rent their unit out and the tenant will need to make sure that the updated paperwork (copy of lease for current year and Sharing of Rules form) is completed. Letters will be going out to the owners and all paperwork needs to be in the office before Pool IDs will be issued.



The locks on the courts have been repaired and as the weather improves, we will replace the practice board, put the nets up and open the courts. Watch your email for notice when this happens. We will continue to wait to have the lights repaired until we find out if we will qualify for the rebate from ComEd. This will potentially save us up to 50% of the cost to replace them.

#### **Grounds Maintenance Director's Report:**

Since the last Board meeting, we completed five grounds service requests. We picked up seasonal needs at Menards and Home Depot.

We inventoried and ordered crew shirts for the upcoming season. Walked the grounds with arborist to determine which trees would be trimmed and removed on this year's cycle.

We investigated an electrical issue on the Acacia maintenance truck that involves the plow. Currently looking for solutions to apparent over volt situation that could lead to further damage of the truck.



We had two snow events during the last month:

- February 17, 2022 Route 1
- February 25, 2022 Route 2.

We purchased \$280.70 in gas for the truck.

We want to remind people that garbage should be placed in black garbage bags left curbside and recyclables should

be in blue bags. We recently had people put out individual items on the ground that should have been placed in a bag. Someone put out an open plastic container, like you would use to soak things in a sink, with twigs and other garbage in there out in the open. Our agreement with SBC requires black bags and blue bags for recyclables. They do pick up empty boxes. Open items, like just mentioned, can cause sanitary problems.

On the subject of blue bags. They are provided by SBC to be used for recyclables. They are not being supplied so people can use them for other things. We recently had a resident request an entire box of blue bags from SBC. When SBC questioned why the resident needed an entire box, they were told that the resident used the blue bags for other things. If any resident needs bags for other things, then it is their responsibility to buy bags for those non recycling needs. The roll of blue bags that SBC hands out has over fifty blue bags. A box contains fifty rolls. There is no reason a resident would need more than one roll to cover a number of months.

Director Consolo motioned to approve the purchase of the standing lawnmower from vendor Russo for the amount of \$9,699.00, plus a tax of \$945.65, for a total of \$10,644.65, which was seconded by Director Boyd.

The motion approved with an 8-0-1 vote.

#### **Townhome Maintenance Director's Report:**

Director Boyd has nothing to report for February.

Covid-19 cases in IHP increased by 18 since Feb. 3; CCDPH reported 838 total on March 6.

Every IHP household can get up to 5 free N95 masks at the village hall while supplies last.

#### Village Board of Trustees Meeting Report for February 10, 2022:

This meeting was held remotely, online. The mayor announced a tentative date of Thursday, April 7, 2022 to hold an open house for the community to see the Wolf Road construction alternatives and get public comments. The second half of Acacia Drive reconstruction should begin soon, and landscaping will be done at the end of that project.

A new police chief, Michael Kurinec, was appointed effective immediately.

Security cameras with license plate readers will be obtained for testing at 2 intersections: Wolf/Plainfield and Wolf/Joliet. They will be evaluated before decisions are made about purchasing more.

Village Goals selected for the upcoming fiscal year include evaluating village building space needs, community events, improvements to Sacagawea Park, and setting aside money for Wolf Road future landscaping.

All village street signs will be replaced to conform with state standards. (I suggested that the village sell the old signs to residents, to keep them out of landfills.)

The next village board meeting is Thursday, March 10, 2022 at 7pm, in-person at the village hall.

#### **Architecture and Landscape Director's Report:**

- For the month of February there was 1 request for new projects and 0 inspections of completed projects.
- Sixteen warning letters were sent for Christmas decorations and other miscellaneous items.
- All WINTER decorations should have been removed by March 1.
- As we move into spring, a reminder that ALL outside changes require ALCC approval. If you have a question, please call the office to verify. Work done without ALCC approval will result in 100.00 fine.
- Only white ground lighting is allowed in front of Acacia homes.

• NO COLORED OR STRING LIGHTING should be displayed other than during the Christmas/holiday season.

#### Welcome baskets:

No welcome baskets were delivered in the month of February.

#### **Acacia Office:**

The Acacia telephone directory has been updated and we would like to be able to share it with residents. But we do not want to have it printed again. It's expensive and the last time we did it very few residents actually picked one up. So, this time it was suggested that we have it available electronically for residents. This would not be on our website as that is not password protected but available to residents who request it via email attachment. The Board will look into a way that it could be accessible to registered

Residents, we will keep you posted on our progress.

We will no longer deliver letters to residents – this is not legal – so from now on all letters will be mailed. Since we know that at times the mail is slow, we will need to adjust our time lines for reinspection for fines.

#### **Election Director's Report:**

Jennifer Cione, Tom Herley and Ben Boyd were the candidate that were voted in on February 22, 2022. Director Cione and Director Herley took their oaths of office and sworn in at the February 22, .2022 Acacia Annual Meeting. Director Boyd was sworn in tonight, March 8, 2022. Thank you to all that helped in the whole process: Linda, Jose, Janice, Phyllis and Amy. Definitely appreciate all who gave their time.

**Homeowner Forum:** No report from resident in audience.

#### **New Business:**

We were sad to hear of the deaths of Bob Bersin, an Acacia original owner and long time Board member and Ruth Davenport, a long time Acacia resident. Our condolences to their family and friends.

Acacia is planning another food drive – we will send date, time and details when they are finalized.

President Eckert motioned to adjourn the regular March 8<sup>th</sup>, 2022 meeting and go into Executive Session at 7:47pm, seconded by Director Boyd.

Motion passed with an 8-0-1 vote.

President Eckert Motioned to close Executive Session and return to Open Session, seconded by Director McMillin.

Motion passed with an 8-0-1 vote.


